Complaints can relate to a course or a service, or to a decision by a disciplinary body, but cannot relate to academic performance. Students must exhaust the university or college's internal procedures before contacting OIA.

Legal aid no longer covers education law, except Special Educational Needs. This means that for most education issues, you will not be able to obtain legal advice for free unless you contact specific providers of legal advice

Anyone needing access to legal aid in relation to an issue related to special educational needs must do so by ringing a telephone gateway (Civil Legal Advice).
